- Additional shrubs within the ginnel
- A complete renovation to the commemorative garden
- Christmas lights in collaboration with the Community Centre and Cricket Club

Concerns were raised about the pruning of the conifers on Silver Street – The Parish Council confirmed that North Yorkshire Council had recently cut them.

- Recent ticketing of a vehicle on Silver Street with one wheel on the double yellow linage.
- Parking on Top Fold during the current construction works.

5.3 Proper Officer

The proper officer provided the following updates:

- **Weight Restriction Signage**: NYC has replaced one sign on Lunnsfield Lane, but no response has been received from Leeds City Council.
- Bank Account: The new bank account is now operational.
- **Green Gym Repairs**: A replacement handle for the green gym has been sourced.
- **Planning Enforcement**: County Councillor Grogan has been contacted for updates regarding planning enforcement issues on Newton Lane and the unauthorised caravan site.
- **Bin Installations**: With support from County Councillor Grogan, NYC has finally installed a new bin on Cut Road and replaced the bin on Silver Street.
- Website Development: The new website design is currently in progress.
- Missing Post Box: Attempts to contact Royal Mail about the missing post box on Silver Street have been unsuccessful so far.

The Council expressed gratitude to Councillors Kos and Baker for repairing the bench on Silver Street and to Councillor Gravill for fixing the fence.

Resolution:

- The Parish Clerk will send letters addressing overgrown vegetation.
- The Clerk will report the overgrown vegetation on Caudle Hill to NYC.
- The Clerk will explore additional contractors for village building repairs.

7.2 To receive and consider recommendations for improving the gravel area from CIIr Wigglesworth.

The Council received and considered recommendations from Councillor Wigglesworth that the installation of an additional border is not a possibility.

Resolution:

Councillors agreed to visit the area to assess the situation.

7.3 To consider grit requirements for winter.

Resolution:

Councillors to assess current store levels and purchase additional grit sand at a cost of no more than £50.

8.2 To consider VAS sign updates and data.

The Council noted that the Caudle Hill sign has been repositioned, and the Rawfield Lane sign has been relocated to Silver Street.

Resolution:

The Parish Clerk will continue to follow up with NYC to ensure the additional VAS sign socket is installed correctly.

8.3 To consider any actions in relation to the vehicle weight restriction area. Resolution:

The Parish Clerk will investigate the process of setting up a Lorry Watch scheme for Council consideration.

8.4 To consider a 20mph limit on Silver Street.

The Council collectively recognised the importance of the issue and acknowledged its significance to the community despite NYC's restrictive criteria.

Resolution: The Parish Clerk will write to the MP about the matter and continue raising it with NYC.

10/24/09 Policy & Procedure

9.1 To receive any updates on the new website implementation.

No significant updates were provided apart from confirmation that construction has begun.

9.2 To consider and approve a vexatious communication and sexual harassment policy.

Resolution:

- The Vexatious Policy was approved.
- The Sexual Harassment Policy will be deferred to the next meeting while advice is sought from YLCA regarding the appropriate number of days to include.

10/24/10 Skatepark & Green Gym

10.1 To consider inspection and health and safety requirements, including risk assessments.

Skatepark Risk Assessment:

Councillor Robinson presented the skatepark risk assessment, identifying the need for surface repairs and repainting. The Clerk is obtaining three quotes for surface repairs. Councillor Robinson reported that the BMX track is no longer functional as a BMX facility and is likely beyond recovery without complete resurfacing. The area is currently more suited for normal biking.

ROSPA Report:

- The report highlighted the recurring issue of the fence, suggesting it should be meshed to prevent climbing. The Council noted the recommendation but did not deem it necessary.
- Concerns about a lack of high-tension wire signage were reviewed. It was confirmed that four visible signs are in place, and no further action is required.

Risk Assessments for Other Areas:

- The green gym, war memorial and volunteer sessions require updated risk assessments. Councillor Robinson will complete these assessments.
- A draft risk assessment for volunteer sessions has been prepared, recommending the use of gloves and high-visibility jackets.

Resolution:

- The Clerk will explore the costs of high-visibility jackets and gloves
- Signage for the BMX track will be updated to reflect its current state, removing references to it as a BMX track.
- Councillors will spray paint the skatepark in the spring.
